Computer Requirements and Time Limits

Optional Certification Exam – Earn the OHCC Credential

Those successfully completing this course will have the *option* to certify as an Officer of Healthcare Compliance, Certified (OHCCSM). The online exam can be taken remotely from the comfort of your home or office. Attempts at the exam are only available by appointment with a professional AIHC proctor.

About the Certification Exam

- The exam is 100 questions, open note three (3) hour proctored exam taken online.
- Passing score is 80%*
- There are four (4) Domains:
 - Compliance Terms, Abbreviations, Acronyms and Definitions
 - Basics of Risk Management and Compliance
 - HIPAA, Safety, EMTALA and Compliance to Applicable Rules & Regulations
 - Knowledge of the OIG Compliance Guidances
- The exam is taken online from the comfort of your home or office by appointment only and scheduled with a professional AIHC proctor
- Certification is approved by the Certification Exam Board

***Policy:** The certification exam is optional, but the cost of one exam attempt is included in your course tuition provided you take the exam within three months of completing the program. Typical pass rate on 1 attempt when the exam is taken within 4 weeks after completing the course is 92%. If you do not pass the first time, you may purchase up to 2 additional attempts at certification totally 3 attempts within 1 year from your course enrollment date.

Maintaining Your OHCC Credential - Once you are certified, you need to maintain your credential by earning six (6) CEUs annually. AIHC also offers free and low-cost CEU programs for our members.
