Optional Certification Exam – Earn the OHCCSM Credential

Those successfully completing this course will have the *option* to certify as an Officer of Healthcare Compliance, Certified (OHCCSM) at no additional cost. The online exam can be taken remotely from the comfort of your home or office. Attempts at the exam are only available by appointment with a professional proctor.

About the Certification Exam

- The exam is a 100 question, open note, three (3) hour proctored exam taken online.
- Passing score is 80%*
- You are tested on three (3) Domains:
 - Domain 1: Compliance Oversight, Fraud, Waste & Laws
 - Domain 2: AI, HIPAA, ADA, Quality and Patient Safety Laws
 - Domain 3: Elements of an Effective, Documented Compliance Program
- The exam is taken online from the comfort of your home or office by appointment only and scheduled with a professional proctor.
- Certification is approved by the Certification Exam Board

***Policy:** The certification exam is optional, but the cost of one exam attempt is included in your course tuition provided you take the exam within three months of completing the program. The typical pass rate on 1 attempt when the exam is taken within 4 weeks after completing the course is 92%. If you do not pass the first time, you may purchase up to 2 additional attempts at certification, totaling 3 attempts within 1 year from your course enrollment date.

Maintaining Your OHCCSM Credential - Once you are certified, you need to maintain your credential by earning six (6) CEUs annually. We also offer free and low-cost CEU programs for our members.
